n 2007, the idea of vocational training through construction projects soon evolved into multiple areas for workshop facilities in the U.S Virgin Islands. **My Brother's Workshop** (MBW) is a nonprofit organization whose vision is to end youth crime and violence in the USVI. With a holistic approach, MBW provides hope through mentoring, counseling, education, on-the-job training and job placement to at-risk and high-risk youth. The organization sees over 150 male and female trainees per year ages 16-24.

Founder and program director Scott Bradley started MBW in St. Thomas in 2007. "The whole idea is a support structure for the young people of the community," said Bradley. The organization has programs that touch on various career paths including vocational training, culinary arts, education, marine repair and rebuild, CAD/CAM programing, heavy equipment, and customer service. The success of MBW led to an increased interest from various programs and organizations on St. Croix; this led to the launch of a sister program in 2016. The workshop training facilities on each island provide opportunities for students to learn about construction, carpentry, woodworking, plumbing, electrical, and masonry trades. Additionally, MBW established a café and bakery in St. Thomas to serve as a training facility that teaches students culinary arts and customer service.

On St. Croix, MBW students continuously lend their building skills like carpentry, plumbing and masonry to several organizations on the island. Their most recent partnership with VI Trail Alliance resulted in three picnic tables and four benches at rest areas along Spur Trail, the newest public trail at the Windsor Farm Trail Network at the East Scenic Road Trailhead. At the start of the pandemic, MBW partnered with Virgin Islands Department of Education (VIDE) on their "No V.I. Child Goes Hungry" Feeding Initiative, which distributed breakfast and lunch to V.I. students each weekday during school closures due to COVID-19. Participation in these community service initiatives help MBW students realize a better path, further their education, and ultimately change their lives. In 2002, the University of the Virgin Islands had a vision: to establish the USVI as the premier business destination of choice for firms in knowledge and technology-intensive sectors. In forging

a partnership with the US Virgin Islands government and the private sector, the

University of the Virgin Islands Research & Technology Park

(RTPark) was established. Their aim was to create a platform for diversifying the USVI economy and for stimulating growth and development of the islands.

The RTPark program offers a wide variety of benefits and incentives that makes becoming a client worthwhile. Benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Attractive tax incentives, the most notable being a 90% reduction on tax liability for the business
- Other tax benefits including withholding, gross receipts, real property and excise tax exemptions
- A Research University Partnership
- Special Programs Including a Comprehensive Entrepreneurship Program
- Living and working in the America's island paradise – the U. S. Virgin Islands

Today, the RTPark is instrumental to the diversification of the regional economy and growing the tech ecosystem between the mainland U.S. and Latin America. 

it the trails at St. Croix's newest outdoor adventure!

The Windsor Farm Trail Network at the

East Scenic Road Trailhead is a new public trail on the island

that features a 2.6-mile loop complete with educational signage, rest areas, lookout points and groomed walking surfaces all under the shade of the rain forest canopy. Thanks to the local non-profit Virgin lalands

profit Virgin Islands
Trail Alliance (VITAL),
this project was
started as part of the
organization's vision
to create, design and
build multi-modal
pathways with
residents,

government and community leaders across the territory for people of all ages and abilities. VITAL President and co-founder Aaron Hutchins shared the importance of the trail and others that will follow in the territory. "The natural resources of the Virgin Islands are far more than pretty beaches and sunsets," said Hutchins. "Our terrestrial resources are increasing and offer more opportunities for getting people out in nature responsibly while enabling better public use and participation in our wonderful green spaces on St. Croix."

Hiking the trail takes a little more than an hour but visitors should allow more time to take in the various educational signage found along the path at fourteen locations and seven rest areas. In addition to learning about the environmental setting, guests will uncover historical aspects of the trees, the surrounding location and notable Virgin Islanders. Three picnic tables and four benches are dispersed at about every half mile. These handcrafted seating areas were built by the youth participants from My

Brother's Workshop, a nonprofit organization that supports at-risk and high-risk young people in the territory

by offering mentoring, counseling, paid job training, education and job placement. At one

of the seven rest stops, you will find signage accompanied by a picnic table and a wooden chair that features historical information about how St. Croix emerged from the ocean 80 million years ago

and was ultimately formed. Another picnic table rest stop offers a picturesque mountain view and shares historical information about St. Croix's two highest peaks: Mount Eagle

and Blue Mountain, which can be seen at the stop.

- Virgin Islands Department of Agriculture, which has granted public use of the public lands around Windsor Farm for trails and outdoor recreation

To get to the trail, head west on East Scenic Road from Salt River Road (also known as Sidney Lee Road). Park in the dirt parking lot on the left of the first bend in the road to find the marked trailhead. Look for the sign and the map that indicates the trail along with the locations of the handcrafted picnic tables and benches along the route.
