HIKE TO THE HAM'S **BLUFF LIGHTHOUSE**

ake in the majestic views of St. Croix's north shore with a brief but intense hike to the historic Ham's Bluff Lighthouse. This 30 to 45-minute hike is located where the island's north shore meets west end and is the perfect combination of breathtaking panoramic views and historical elements. The hike to the lighthouse is almost entirely uphill along a partially shaded path. Once you've made it to the top, you are rewarded with views of blue as far as



the eye can see! The cool Caribbean breeze whips itself around you, offering a much needed reprieve after the vigorous ascent to the historic site. On a

clear day, you can see neighboring islands to the north and west.

Designed and built by the Danish between 1913 and 1915, this cylindrical lighthouse made of cast iron on a concrete foundation once served as a beacon for ships at sea along St. Croix's coastline. The Danish West Indies were sold to the United States in 1917, resulting in the U.S. Coast Guard taking over its operation. Currently, the lighthouse is deteriorating since it's deactivation in the mid-1990s but it's still in pretty good shape.

To get to the starting point of the hike, take Route 63 heading North from Frederiksted closely following the shoreline. When the ocean is no longer visible, look for the first narrow road on the left marked by two pillars and turn left onto that road. Follow the road for about ½ mile until it dead ends at the National Guard Training Center. Park in the dirt areas alongside the road just outside the gate and you will see a trail leading around the west side of the fenced area along the bay.

For your safety, always hike with a friend and attempt this hike only if you are physically fit enough to do so. Be sure to wear appropriate footwear, long pants for overgrown grass and brush and bring your water, sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat and insect repellant. Have fun exploring one of St. Croix's most treasured sites and don't forget to take lost of pictures to commemorate your visit.

ho would have known that St. Croix would be the home of the world's first and only distilled-from-breadfruit vodka? Mutiny Island Vodka is the first of its kind where it is produced

using an ingredient that is true to St. Croix and many islands throughout the Caribbean – the breadfruit. Originated in New Guinea and the Indo-Malay region, breadfruit spread throughout the Pacific and made its way to the Caribbean. It is said that it could possibly solve world hunger with its starchy, potato-like consistency that is high in protein and rich in nutrients and vitamins.

Birthed on St. Croix and nurtutred during the tumultuous 2017 year of the hurricanes, award-

winning chef Todd Manley partnered with master distiller Chris Richeson to craft a perfect distillation using breadfruit and water. "Back in 2007, we had the idea to produce an agricultural-based product on St. Croix since it used to be an agricultural island," said Manley. What they got in return was a luxury island vodka that is easily classified as a clean spirit with no added sugars or chemicals. Its clear, distinctive taste offers a smoothness that can rival some of the best vodka spirits on the market. In addition to the flagship vodka, Mutiny Island Vodka Small Batch Series uses seasonal fruits to add to their lineup. Pineapple, coconut, smoked peppers, coffee, sorrel, sour orange

and mango are a few of the flavors that have been released to date.

In October 2018, Manley and team acquired the old

Island Dairies facility in Estate
Sion Farm to be the new home
for Mutiny Island Vodka. Donning
a new name, Sion Farm Distillery,
this is where all bottling, labeling,
corking and packaging of Mutiny
Island Vodka takes place.
Visitors can take a tour of the
distillery to learn more about how
the vodka is created followed by

a tasting session featuring one-


of-a-kind Mutiny Island Vodka signature drinks. When the threat of COVID-19 resulted in a shortage of disinfectants

coupled with a decline in sales due to quarantine, the makers of Mutiny Island Vodka began producing a hand sanitizer using a combination of breadfruit-distilled ethyl alcohol (70 percent ABV) and locally sourced aloe vera gel. It is now the primary hand sanitizing solution found in restaurants, hotels and other establishments throughout the territory.

upport St. Croix's environment in style with a purchase of beautiful local jewelry that highlights the endangered leatherback turtle. Renowned St. Croix jewelry studio Crucian Gold partnered with St. Croix Environmental Association (SEA) to create the Leatherback Collection. Inspired by the leatherback turtle, the largest turtle on earth, the collection was designed by SEA's board member, Kynoch Reale-Munroe. The idea for the collection came from various conversations that stemmed from a desire to make a difference through environmental action to help conserve and protect these majestic creatures. While leatherback turtles have been in existence for over 100 million years, their future is unknown due to the threat of extinction. They are currently listed as endangered under the Endangered Species Act and face threats on both nesting beaches and in the marine environment. Incidental capture in

fishing gear and harvest of leatherback eggs and adults are the greatest of these threats to their population. That is why initiatives like Crucian Gold's Leatherback Collection are critical to their survival through awareness and supporting intensive leatherback research, monitoring and conserving the habitats of the species.

The Leatherback Collection was launched in 2020 on World Turtle Day. This day originated in 2000 by the American Tortoise Rescue as an annual observance to help people

celebrate and protect turtles and tortoises and their disappearing habitats around the world. It is celebrated yearly throughout the world on May 23rd.

Twenty (20) percent of the collection sales are donated to SEA's Leatherback monitoring program that use GPS and satellite technology to follow the turtles once they leave St. Croix's nesting beaches. With this program, you can see other locations where the turtles may be nesting and follow their northward migration after the nesting season.


